How you are graded in this class:


- Assignments, tests and quizzes are 90% of your grade, if it is assigned it is graded and in Skyward.



Attendance:

Make-up Work:

Doing make-up assignments can never compensate for the classroom experiences and discussions that students miss while absent. This section is designed to explain the process by which a student may make-up work missed while absent.

- No make-up work will be accepted for truancy.
- Class participation points can be made up, but will not comprise more than 10% of the total grade. Penalties come from inappropriate behavior such as tardies, being unprepared, the inappropriate use of cell phones or electronic devices, not respecting the rights of others, not following the school/district dress code, and not participating in class, etc.
- All assignments will be posted on http://msmcdushistory.pbworks.com
- All assignments missed due to an approved absence must be completed within five school days of the student returning to class. After five school days it will be considered late and 50% of the credit will be deducted.
- If you are absent on the day of a test or quiz, you must take the make-up test or quiz within FIVE SCHOOL DAYS after the regular test or quiz was given. After five school days you will NOT be able to make it up and will receive a ZERO.
- It is the student's responsibility to monitor his/ her attendance and required make up work. Attendance is posted daily.

Late Work:

Work is late if it is handed in after the <u>START</u> of the class in which is due. <u>All late work</u>, other than assignments turned in within 5 days of an excused absence, <u>will receive a 50% deduction</u>.

NO INCOMPLETE LATE WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Late work can be turned in up to 3 days before the midterm and 3 days before the end of the semester. Work due before midterm cannot be made up after midterm. No late work will be accepted after the three days before midterm and the last three days before the end of the semester.
